


#### **Branching Out Vocabulary Words – Flashcards**

## **Agroforestry**

The practice of combining forestry and agriculture in a mutually beneficial way.



### Oxygen

The life-supporting component of the air. It is vital to all living things on the planet.



#### **Carbon Dioxide**

A colourless, odourless gas that is produced by burning carbon. It is also breathed out by humans and animals.



#### **Shelter**

A place giving temporary protection (cover) from natural elements or danger.



## Grazing

Land where farm animals feed on grass.



# Carbon Footprint

The amount of carbon that is released into the atmosphere as the result of an individual, event, organisation or product.



## Climate Change

Any significant or abnormal changes to the climate/weather around the globe.



## Non-renewable Resource

Natural resources that cannot be made again.



#### **Fossil Fuels**

A natural fuel such as coal, oil and gas that have been buried deep into the earth for millions of years.



## Renewable Resource

Natural resources that can be used repeatedly and does not run out because it is naturally replaced.

Examples: trees, solar energy and wind energy.



#### **Wind Turbine**

Large fan-like wheels that turn (rotate) when wind passes over the blades of the wheel. The spinning fanblades (wheel) creates electricity.



#### **Solar Panels**

A panel designed to absorb the sun's rays as a source of energy for generating electricity or heating.



## **Biodiversity**

The variety of plant and animal life in the world or in a particular habitat.



#### **Flora**

All the plants in a particular place or time in history.



#### **Fauna**

All the animals of a particular place or time in history.



## **Species**

A set of animals or plants in which the members have similar characteristics to each other and can breed with each other.



### **Food Chain**

A series of different living things that depend on the next as a source of food.



#### **Silviculture**

The process of growing, managing and harvesting/retaining trees.



#### **Forester**

A skilled person who is in charge of planting, managing and caring for trees in a forest.



#### **Timber**

Wood prepared for use in building or carpentry.



#### Sawmill

A factory in which logs are cut down and processed into different shapes and sizes by a machine.



## **Wood Energy**

Energy created from wood or wood-based products usually though the combustion processes (burning).



#### **Trail**

A designated path/way that is constructed or maintained so as to follow by foot (walking).



#### **Trail Marker**

Signs or objects posted/laid out on trail paths to help people stay on track.



### **Compass**

A device for determining directions by means of a magnetic needle turning freely on a pivot and pointing to the magnetic North.



## Wildlife Ranger

A person whose job is to look after (maintaining and protecting) a forest or large park.
